## SHOE ORGANIZER AS DEEP STORAGE FOR PRODUCTS

The roomy pockets of an over-the-door shoe organizer are great for keeping beauty supplies tidy, says Monica Ricci. "If you're petite, cut off the bottom half of the bag and mount the top half on hooks at waist level so you can reach inside."

## RING BOWL AS AN ELASTICS CATCHER!

Hair ties stay especially neat in a ring bowl with a center pole. If you're tucking one in a drawer, line its underside with self-adhesive shelf liner to prevent it from sliding around, suggests Sara Eizen.
